Educational Objectives At the conclusion of the meeting, attendees will know: the psychiatric manifestations of epilepsy; indications for, and current data on the clinical uses of electroconvulsive therapy; a practical update on use of neuropsychological testing in clinical practice; how to evaluate and manage dementia; the genetics of risk factors for, and psychiatric aspects of, Parkinson's Disease and other movement disorders; the research data on, and clinical indications for, Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation; the neurobiological effects of psychodynamic psychotherapy; the neurobiology of depression, including the importance of GABA receptors; biology of depression, neuroimaging patterns in mental neurologic disorders; how psychodynamic themes portrayed in literature can be useful in clinical practice; the neurobiology of sexuality; and the current status of the treatment needs of the mentally ill in prisons.
